COUNSELING NEWS:

Tutoring- Peer tutoring is available on Tuesdays and Wednesdays at lunch and afterschool in the counseling office. Tutoring for students who are struggling in Spanish and other subjects.

ARE YOU INTERESTED IN ATTENDING WINTER TERM TO MAKE UP AN ACADEMIC CLASS? (5 credits): The Winter Term Program (December 2021) for students who need to earn up to 5 credits of summer school to stay on their Graduation Track. Classes can include English, Social Studies, and Math. The Independent Study for Credit Makeup will run from December 20th December 29th (Monday – Wednesday each week). Your Independent Study teacher will contact you the week of December 17th. Students missing more than one meeting with their Independent Study teacher and/or failing to turn in their weekly assigned work will be dropped. Independent Study will be held at Colusa High School. Western Undergraduate Exchange: Considering applying to out of state colleges? Check out the Western Undergraduate Exchange -WUE. WUE students in Western states may enroll in participating two-year and four-year public college programs at a reduced tuition level: up to 150 percent of the institution's regular resident tuition. SENIOR NEWS:

FINANCIAL AID: Seniors who are interested in receiving federal and state financial aid for college should apply for Free Application for Federal Student Aid -FAFSA. The application process is free and only takes 30 minutes. Both Student and Parent will need to have a FSA ID to submit your application. The FSA ID gives you access to Federal Student Aid's online systems and can serve as your legal signature. You should have your social security number and personal email address and/or cell phone. Undocumented students who are interested in receiving State Financial Aid for college, including grants and scholarships are eligible to apply for the California Dream Act Application -CADAA please see the attached link. The application opens October 1st. CADAA website: <https://dream.csac.ca.gov>

Informational links regarding FAFSA and CADAA have been posted to the Google Class of 2022. Please contact the Counseling Office with any questions, concerns, or if you need any assistance.

SCHOLARSHIPS: Please read scholarship applications completely before you begin. Make sure you have all of your supporting documents, and that you meet eligibility requirements. When asking for a letter of recommendation, please include a resume, or list of extracurricular activities, and let your recommender know of your educational plans and career/occupational goals. Keep organized, pay attention to deadlines, and make copies of your applications. Check with the Counseling Office if you have any questions regarding any scholarship application. **Good Luck!!**

Dr. Juan Andrade Jr. Scholarships - \$1,000 20 awards. Hagan Scholarship Foundation

Helping rural students graduate college debt-free. Need-Based Merit Scholarships up to \$6,000 each semester.
