Decades of Colusa High School alumni are familiar with the term "Cutting the Square". Simple city streets lined with homes, businesses and trees provides an avenue for many to enjoy a social tradition in Colusa.

West on Market Street to 10th, then south to Fremont, east to Bridge Street, then north back to Market completes the route. The lure of traveling this square over and over can be simply explained by the fact that you become concerned about what you might miss when you're not going around it.

Friendships, personalities and adventure can all be developed on a ride around the square. Maybe that girl or boy you were too shy to approach at school would wave to you

in a passing car. Pulling along side your buddies on Market or waving to your friends at Rick's was an assuring sense of belonging on the square. Even the popular crowd would wave to the "squares", when "cutting the square". Visiting cruisers from nearby towns were met with curiosity or stares as the procession continued around and around.

From hot rods and muscle cars to the family cruiser, if you had

a car, or connections to a ride, cutting the square was the place to be. There are all sorts of times that people in Colusa cut the square. Usually a Friday or Saturday night attracted the largest crowd. But a precisely timed trip around the square on a school morning and getting to class before the bell rang was a real art. That trip to the grocery store in the evening for mom usually involved at least one revolution of the town. A long line at Chung Sun Market was a good excuse for the delay in time. Still today, the youth and adults of Colusa enjoy the path of the square. Four wheel drive pickups and

economy cars now occupy the driving lanes and groups of people walking; biking and running follow the path enjoying the outdoors.

For many, finishing high school and choosing the next path in life, forced a turn off the carousel of "cutting the square", and opened a path to the world outside. Which direction did you take? Did the military ask you to stop, turn and defend our country? We know that continuing your education at college or graduate school was a steep hill out of town. Travel could have led you in any direction, and we hope you remembered that all roads

eventually lead to home. Marriage hopefully made you happy that you changed course and crossed the path of the one you love. And for those who followed the sign "caution men at work" we hope all your dreams have come true.




who would like a flatter course. We offered a course that was Flat, Fast, and Fun.


Riders had the choice of riding 117 miles, 66 miles, or 39 miles. We had thirty riders and

Chung Sun Market turns 90

In the 1920's, Kam Lee would close his small grocery store on Main Street throughout the day to make deliveries to his customers in Colusa. A decade or so later. Lee was doing the same thing, only the bike had been replaced with a small, rickety panel truck.

His store, Chung Sun Market, was known for good service, and Lee was no stranger to hard work. "Dad was in business almost 70 years before he finally stopped working," said Lee's son, Jimmy, one of the remaining family owners of the market, which celebrated its 90th year in business on Friday May 7th, 2010.

Like many of the Chinese who settled in Northern California, Lee, who would have been known Lee Kam Kee in native country, emigrated from the Canton region of southern China to the Bay Area. He was only 16 years old when he arrived in San

Francisco in 1916, and was only 20 when a cousin invited him to Colusa to learn the grocery business. At the time. Lee was working as a houseboy for the O'Sullivan family in Williams, but was eager to learn the trade from the ground up and go into business for himself. "Dad's first cash register was a carpenter's apron," Jimmy Lee said. "It had three pockets, so he could make change after each sell."



Lee established Chung Sun

Market on Main Street in 1920, naming the store after Sun Yat-sen (Sun Zhongshan), the Chinese revolutionary and political leader who played an instrumental role in overthrowing the Qing Dynasty in 1911, the last imperial dynasty of China. When Lee opened Chung Sun in Colusa's Chinese district, there were more than 300 Asian people living by the river on the north side of town. In addition to serving the Asian community, Lee provided goods and produce to the general public of the county.

Lee traveled all the way back to China to meet his wife, Gee Kim Yin, the daughter of another Chinese immigrant living in Colusa. They were married in China, but it took more than 10 years before Lee was able to bring his bride and son, Leland, to America. With his wife in Colusa, Leland was soon followed by daughter Annette (Park), sons Herbert, Jimmy, Robert, a daughter Jeannette, a son Roy, then two more daughters, Donna (Chung) and Delia (Tom). They were all were born in either Woodland or Colusa, California.

The Lee children helped their father in the store, putting together orders which were telephoned in from customers - a common way of doing business until the 1960's, when nearly all American housewives drove their own cars. The children would also follow customers through the store, pulling items from the shelves and running them to the counter – a manner of shopping that was replaced by the modern shopping cart and well stocked shelves.

Herbert and Annette are now deceased, along with their parents. Leland lives in Sacramento, while Donna makes her home in El Cerrito. Jeannette lives in New York and Delia in Honolulu. Jimmy, Robert and Roy Lee still run Chung Sun Market with the same principles as their father, with kindness and generosity to the community. "Colusa has been very good to us," Jimmy Lee said. "That is why we believe in giving back to the community. That is what dad believed."

Chung Sun Market has remained an icon in the community, known for its highquality meat and produce, excellent customer service and a great supporter of local organizations and community events.

Chung Sun is the oldest, continuously operated, family owned grocery store in Colusa County. The store held a one-day celebration in honor of its 90th year on Friday, May 7th, 2010.
