



Alum "Woodie W. Humburg" Remembered

The Colusa High School Alumni Association is sad to announce that alum Woodie W. Humburg, Class of 1933, passed away on December 5th, 2011. Born on September 8th, 1915, he was 96 years old and was laid to rest on May 20th, 2012 here in Colusa with his family at the cemetery on Wilson Road.

Woodie was a great friend and supporter of the alumni association and shared donations, treasured memories and personal memorabilia with our school. Within the last few years, he personally visited the old brick high school on 10th street in Colusa to donate his original Colusa High School championship football of 1933, and a championship baseball of 1933, both signed and dated by all the team members of

that year. He also provided original Colusa newspaper articles written about the team's successes. After his graduation from Colusa High School in 1933, Woodie attended Cal Berkeley to play baseball and later had a successful business career in engineering and building design.

A year before his death, Woodie set up a \$5000 scholar-ship fund with the Colusa County Scholarship Program. A scholarship of \$1000 will be awarded each year for five years to financially assist and recognize outstanding academic students from Colusa High School that have exceptional goals toward future education. Hailey Prasad, a 2012 graduate of Colusa High School, was the recipient of this years' scholar-ship.
