> > someone in the accounting class. This creative design was only part of the grand art scheme that was developed in this project. Jean Summerville was teaching her students the "fine art" of say-





Woodning and other materials so they could express their artistic abilities.


All of us who attended Colusa High School exhibited an artistic ability whether it was in academics, athletics, business, music,
















## An Honorary Alumni

During the 2002 Colusa High School academic year, our alumni committee began the work and planning to develop this annual newsletter. Throughout all the 17 years of reaching out to you, a very talented and community minded gentleman by the name of Larry Yeghoian, quietly gave countless hours of his time and interest to us, developing and supporting our communication with you.

On Sunday, September 1, 2019, in the early morning hours, we lost Larry, as he suddenly passed away in his home, here in Colusa. We wanted to communicate with you and express our sorrow in losing such a talented friend of our community and school district, as he will be hard to replace.

Larry loved to read the many memories that the Colusa High School alumni would send back each year with their newsletter donations. Many times he wished that his home town high school would develop a newsletter, where the alumni could reconnect with each other, and remember their time in school back at home.

During the early years of this publication, Larry was the Colusa Unified School District Superintendent. He was a very unique individual, in that he was a great academic administrator who guided a very busy program for many years, yet he always took the time to support our community and encouraged us to remember our past. Although the money we generated through donations really benefited his school district, he was more impressed by all of you, who expressed a love for Colusa and your school.

His love for our community was not limited to his work for our school district. He was very involved with our local Lions Club. For years you would find him early in the morning serving our community by putting out American Flags that would line the streets of Colusa on every holiday and then respectfully retired them in the evenings, by collecting and putting them away. You would see him in his Lions vest at the beginning of our Colusa County Fair Parade, starting all the entrants on their way down Market Street to the awaiting crowds of people. An annual bike ride that had hundreds participate over



the years, was managed by Larry and his fellow Lions who guided bikers on 40 - 70 and 100 mile courses along the Sacramento River and around the Sutter Buttes. All the funds raised were for local donation projects and scholarships for students.

Being an educator and administrator, he guided us with wisdom and positive critique concerning articles and theme content for this newsletter. The issue and theme that gave him the most joy was the "Cutting the Square" article that outlined our town hobby of the past. He owned a muscle car, and over the years had participated in many local car shows, so cruising was a favorite topic.

Even though he retired from our school district seven years ago, he still supported the effort to produce this newsletter. Every year, Larry and his wife Kandy, as members of our alumni committee, would fold and prepare more than 3000 newsletters before our committee met to stamp and label the letters. The week that Larry passed away, we were scheduled to print, fold and mail this issue to you. We took a short pause, to honor Larry and get this article in place, to inform you of our community loss.

While reflecting on this sad event, we could not help but wonder, what would Larry do in this situation? He would have said, "What do we need to do next?" "Let's get a plan and get to work!" So let's honor his example and work ethic, that he so generously shared with all of us.

The perfect time to write about cars from when we were teenagers is during Hot August Nights in Reno, which is right NOW. In fact, I just saw Mark and Robbie Andreotti and

Woody and Kathy Yerxa yesterday at the event.

During the late 50s and early 60s

you had to build a hot car—you didn't just order one. Those were the days of the J. C. Whitney and Honest Charley parts catalogues. I knew them well.

Common terminology back then included twice pipes, three on the tree, four on the floor, second gear scratch, glass packs and back rapping. We used to "cut the square" and hangout at Rick's and Jenkies. I remember when Rick rolled into town in his VW bug with chrome reverse wheels!

Everyone had to stop at Peterson's Chevron, Barney's Shell, Hap's 76 or Wally's Arco for gas. It was 31 cents a

Graham's Restaurant, I was greeted by a CHP officer leaning on his car on the right side of the road and a City Police Officer, Jack Calcagno on the left side. I explained that we always preferred to shop locally, so I would deal with him. He then presented me with my ticket!

I can also remember dimmer switches on the floor, arm signals, jockey boxes, rumble seats, push button gear shifts, cigarette lighters, ash

dances with all the car radios tuned in to the same station.

Those were the days you could work on your own car and if it wouldn't start you could push it or pull it and pop the clutch and off you went. It didn't get any better than that.

And, now about electric cars—they are quiet and boring with zero personality!
